BLACK AND LATINO MEN READ ESSAY CONTEST INFORMATION

- Eligible Participants: The Black and Latino Men Read annual essay contest is open to Black and Latino male students currently enrolled in either a high school, community college, and/or 4-year college/university.
- o **BLMR Winners' Financial Awards**: Two winners will receive a financial award of \$1,000 each.
- Contest Deadline: The deadline is 12 noon, PST, October 31st. No late entries will be accepted.

Contest Criteria:

Students must be 14 years of age or older to participate.

A Black and Latino male student currently enrolled in either a high school, community college, and/or 4-year college/university.

Submission of a typed essay and a photo of you reading your selected book.

- o BLMR Essay Contest Writing Prompt: Write about a fictional character or a person in a nonfiction book who faced a challenging obstacle. Describe both the efforts your chosen character or chosen individual took to overcome the challenging obstacle and the lessons the character or individual learned from those efforts. Finally, considering the efforts of your selected character or individual, would you have handled the challenging obstacle in the same way or differently. Make sure you incorporate quotes from the text to support your evidence and analyses.
- Entrant's Essay Requirements: The typed essay should have the following:

Answer the writing prompt. Include evidence from the text to support your perspectives and analyses.

Include a brief summary of the book's plot.

The essay must be typed, double-spaced, 1 ½ pages minimum, and 2 pages maximum.

At the top of the essay type your name, cell #, complete mailing address, and your school's name.

Submit a photo of you reading your selected book.

Black and Latino Men Read's Winners and Awards

All Black and Latino Men Read's winners will be required to complete a Consent Form.

Winners will receive their financial awards by December 30th.
